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AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The University of South Carolina Union provides a high-quality, competitive higher education that will enable students to thrive in a global, diverse, and constantly changing environment. By providing a varied curriculum, grounded in the Liberal Arts, USC Union emphasizes a close working relationship among students, faculty, staff, and the community that promotes self-reliance, freedom of thought and expression, productive citizenship, and critical thinking. Students at USC Union can obtain an Associate of Arts and an Associate of Science, in addition to having access to the baccalaureate degrees available through Palmetto College and the BSN program in partnership with USC Aiken.

Strategic Priority 1: Attract, inspire, challenge, and enable our students to become innovative thinkers and transformative leaders.

The first strategic priority in the University of South Carolina's strategic plan, For South Carolina; A Path to Excellence, has three distinct goals:

1. Attract and retain a highly qualified, appropriately sized and diverse student body at all levels.
2. Provide the highest quality of rigorous instruction and student-centric educational experience to all students.
3. Create innovative, transformative and collaborative lifelong learners.

The USC Union campus has made it a priority to enhance student enrollment and retention. During Fall 2022, the headcount of enrolled students reached 1,070, but slightly decreased to 953 for Spring 2023. This decline can be attributed to the conclusion of the Pacer Pathway Program with USC Aiken and the termination of a significant dual enrollment partnership with Legion Collegiate Academy. However, enrollment is projected to increase for Fall 2023 due to several ongoing efforts including new academic offerings, new and expansions of continuing dual enrollment partnerships, and collaborations with Union County High School and Clinton High School for early college programs. The collaboration with USC Aiken to provide the BSN degree on the Union campus is a significant contributor to the growth in enrollment. Under this program, students fulfill their pre-nursing prerequisites at USC Union, positioning them to submit a strong application for the upper division program. By remaining at Union, students can complete the final two years of their degree, carry out their clinical rotations locally, and even pursue employment within our service area if they prefer.

To meet the goals associated with this strategic priority, the campus has implemented several measures including study abroad opportunities and other global learning initiatives, supporting students through the Student Academic Success Center, promoting Graduation with Leadership Distinction, increasing funding for undergraduate research, and enriching student life offerings through NJCAA level athletics and club sports, and tuition assistance. Specifically, students from USC Union have had the opportunity to embark on educational journeys to Costa Rica, Ireland, France, and Spain. Over the summer of 2023, a group of eight students participated in a summer study program in Guatemala as a vital part of their PSYC 480: Multi-Cultural Psychology course. In this program, they put into practice the principles of multi-cultural psychology theory and studied cultural skills to foster intercultural exposure and comprehension. During their time in Guatemala, the students dedicated a week to a service-learning project, primarily involving teaching and engaging with young children at a local public school in Antigua. To continue fostering global learning, the campus recently organized a virtual Latin American Film Festival, made possible through a grant received by Dr. Steven Lownes, Assistant Professor of

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World Languages. This enriching festival featured a curated selection of five films from Latin America, accompanied by faculty expertise, aimed at promoting interdisciplinary perspectives and stimulating academic discussions centered around the films. In total, there were 133 unique viewers who engaged in the streaming experience. To enhance global learning within the classroom, our faculty members utilize inventive teaching methods. For instance, Gale Ashmore, an instructor of Spanish, has implemented the TalkAbroad Program through a grant. This program offers students the valuable opportunity to learn a new language by engaging in conversations with native speakers of that language. This immersive experience contributes significantly to language acquisition and cultural understanding.

There has been a concerted effort to increase the impact of the Student Academic Success Center on campus. The Center remains dedicated to establishing connections with both students and the community, organizing events, and providing tutoring services. To further bolster its impact, the Center has engaged a larger number of faculty members on campus. By expanding its involvement, the Center strives to enrich students' educational journeys through the implementation of diverse campus events, including academic workshops and career-focused programs. This concerted effort aims to enhance the overall educational experience of students at USC Union.

USC Union actively promotes and aids students who aspire to achieve Graduation with Leadership Distinction (GLD), a program administered by the USC Center for Integrative and Experiential Learning as part of USC's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP). The GLD program plays a crucial role in enriching students' educational journeys by bridging the gap between classroom learning and meaningful experiences beyond the traditional academic setting. Through fulfilling the GLD requirements, students not only connect their classroom knowledge with real-world experiences but also develop a deeper understanding of the value of their education. As part of the GLD program, students showcase their experiences by delivering presentations and creating e-portfolios. These presentations serve as a platform for students to reflect on and articulate the valuable skills and insights they have gained from their time at USC. The e-portfolios, on the other hand, provide a tangible and comprehensive record of their achievements, which can be shared with prospective employers as a testament to their growth, competence, and dedication during their academic journey at USC. During the current academic year, three students submitted applications for GLD, with one student pursuing two pathways. Out of the three applications, two students were successfully awarded the distinction—one at the bachelor's level and the other at the associate level. To raise awareness about the program, the Office of Academic and Student Affairs implements focused marketing strategies targeting eligible students. Moving forward, our objective is to establish a dedicated career corner within the Student Academic Success Center, strengthen our connections with local service organizations, and sustain our commitment to research mentorship initiatives. Moreover, several professors enhance the educational experience by incorporating hands-on experiences directly into their classroom instruction, complementing the external opportunities available to students. For instance, in PCAM 101, pre-nursing students engage in practical exercises in the skills lab, utilizing various scenarios and simulation manikins to practice communication techniques. In NURS 220, students maintain a food diary to gain real-world insights into nutritional status. UNIV 101 students actively participate in fundraising initiatives for various causes in the upstate of South Carolina. In EDPY 401, students embark on a clinical experience, partnering with our local school district to engage with teachers and students who learn differently, fostering one-on-one interactions in a mainstreamed classroom environment. Additionally, we have established a partnership with the South Carolina Afterschool Alliance, offering a course where students work directly with a local afterschool program within our service area. These hands-on opportunities provide students with valuable practical skills and the chance to make a positive impact in their community.

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USC Union is committed to fostering undergraduate research opportunities and provides annual summer research funding to deserving students and faculty members. In the current year, five students were granted Palmetto Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE) awards, enabling them to delve into diverse research areas. These projects encompassed subjects such as rural odontology, faculty welfare, and adverse childhood experiences. Also in the current year, we had six students present research at USC’s Discover USC and four students present at the annual meeting of the Southeastern Psychological Associate in New Orleans. By offering students the opportunity to engage in undergraduate research, USC Union contributes to the advancement of knowledge in various fields.

USC is fully committed to expanding and strengthening our athletics program while providing unwavering support to our student-athletes. Our athletics program encompasses a range of sports, including men's soccer, baseball, softball, and women's volleyball, all competing at the NJCAA level. Additionally, we offer club-level teams for bass fishing, e-sports, and a rifle team. Looking ahead, we plan to begin a club-level golf team based at our Laurens location. USC Union places significant emphasis on fostering excellence both on and off the field. In the current year, our student-athletes have demonstrated remarkable dedication to academic success, as reflected in their team GPAs. The softball team achieved an outstanding GPA of 3.795, while soccer recorded a commendable 3.57. The baseball team maintained a solid GPA of 3.165, and volleyball exhibited a strong GPA of 3.32. These impressive team GPAs showcase the campus's dedication to fostering academic excellence and prioritizing the success of our student-athletes in their educational pursuits. Our student-athletes have received well-deserved recognition for their athletic achievements. Several players have earned notable accolades, including being named to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Team All-Region 10. In addition, a softball player and a baseball player were recognized as runners-up for Region 10 Player of the Year, while a soccer player was named the Region 10 Player of the Year. These accomplishments highlight the exceptional talent and dedication of our student-athletes and their contributions to the success of our athletic program. Our student-athletes actively engage in community service, demonstrating their commitment to making a positive impact beyond the field. They serve as buddies for the Miracle League, providing support and companionship to individuals with disabilities. Additionally, they enthusiastically participate in the Union County Christmas Parade, spreading holiday cheer throughout the community. Our student-athletes also volunteer their time as coaches and referees at the YMCA, contributing to the development and well-being of young athletes. Their involvement in these community initiatives showcases their dedication to serving others and being positive role models in the community.

The support USC Union receives from Union County and Laurens County is invaluable and plays a significant role in the expansion of our student body. Specifically, this support manifests in the form of scholarships. Union County offers scholarships that cover tuition and fees for in-county high school graduates who have achieved a minimum GPA of 3.0. Similarly, Laurens County has a parallel program that provides scholarships for in-county high school graduates with a minimum GPA of 2.0. These scholarship programs not only foster educational opportunities for local students but also contribute to the overall growth and diversity of our student population.

In addition to prioritizing enrollment growth, USC Union has undertaken significant endeavors to enhance student retention and success rates. The undergraduate retention rates for USC Union in previous years were as follows: 26% from Fall 2014 to Fall 2015, 26.4% from Fall 2015 to Fall 2016, 37.8% from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017, 41.3% from Fall 2017 to Fall 2018, 48.9% from Fall 2018 to Fall 2019, 50.7% from Fall 2019 to Fall 2020, and 47.7% from Fall 2020 to Fall 2021. Looking ahead, we anticipate an increase in retention rates for future cohorts. In terms of success, the latest cohort (2018

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entering full-time students, captured at the 150% completion time) exhibited a success rate of 73.3%, a significant improvement compared to the previous cohort's rate of 57.5%. We attribute this positive trend to the range of services and support mentioned earlier, as well as the return to normalcy following the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. To further bolster these rates, the campus has established two committees dedicated to retention and success efforts. The first committee is the Academic Intervention Committee, which aims to provide early intervention across campus units to support students who are facing academic challenges. This proactive approach ensures that students in poor academic standing have access to the necessary resources to succeed academically. The second committee, known as the Student Care and Outreach Team (CARE Team), consists of faculty and staff members who offer individual attention and resources to students of concern, including those exhibiting self-injurious or erratic behaviors. These committees play a vital role in fostering a supportive environment and promoting the retention and success of our students.

Strategic Priority 1: Assemble and cultivate a world-class faculty and staff.

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Recruit and develop diverse faculty members who are excellent instructors and recognized scholars with a breadth of experience.
2. Actively attract, recruit, hire and retain a diverse and highly talented staff.
3. Produce and instill a shared culture of excellence.

On the Union campus, our efforts to expand the faculty and academic offerings are instrumental in addressing our goals. In the current year, we have successfully hired several new faculty members to enrich our educational environment. These include a full-time instructor of mathematics, an assistant professor of history, an assistant professor of African American studies, and an assistant professor of psychology. Additionally, we recently completed a search for an instructor of nursing who is expected to join our team in the upcoming fall. Moving forward, our focus will be on recruiting six new faculty members specializing in the social sciences and humanities. By adding expertise in these areas, we aim to enhance the breadth and depth of academic opportunities available to our students. In terms of staff, we have made strategic additions to our team. These include a temporary office assistant, a dual enrollment coordinator, an assistant director of financial aid, a financial aid assistant, a temporary assistant softball coach, a temporary e-sports coach, a temporary golf coach, a temporary volleyball coach, and a temporary facilities assistant. Looking ahead, we have plans to hire a new library technology coordinator, academic support specialist, and Laurens location site coordinator. These upcoming hires will play key roles in supporting our students' educational journeys. Through these new faculty and staff members, we aim to provide an enriched learning environment, expanded academic offerings, and enhanced support services for our students.

At USC Union, full-time faculty members have a standard teaching load of 12 contact hours per semester, allowing them to dedicate ample time to their students' education. Furthermore, faculty members have the opportunity to request a course reduction in order to pursue scholarly activities throughout the academic year. In both teaching and scholarship, faculty receive extensive support from the campus and Palmetto College. To facilitate faculty scholarship, the Union campus provides a robust travel budget, enabling faculty to present their work at conferences across the nation and even internationally. This support not only enhances the faculty members' expertise but also enriches the classroom experience for students. It creates additional opportunities for faculty to involve students in collaborative, original research projects. The benefits of this collaborative approach can be seen in the

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achievements of students who have participated in projects funded by grants like the Palmetto Undergraduate Research Experience (PURE) grant mentioned earlier. Moreover, the Research Club on campus plays a pivotal role in fostering these collaborations between faculty and students. Throughout the year, the Research Club organized three events that provided a platform for faculty and students to showcase their scholarly pursuits within the campus community. These events promote an atmosphere of intellectual engagement and encourage the exchange of ideas among members of the academic community. By supporting faculty members in their teaching and scholarship endeavors, USC Union cultivates an environment that promotes high-quality education, collaborative research opportunities, and the overall academic growth of students. Additionally, faculty members at USC Union can participate in a range of teaching workshops, webinars, and training sessions offered throughout the year, largely facilitated by the Center for Teaching Excellence. These resources aim to enhance pedagogical skills and support faculty in their teaching endeavors. Faculty members also have access to various grants provided by Palmetto College and USC Columbia. These grants offer opportunities for faculty to pursue research, professional development, and innovative teaching practices. Faculty can explore funding options to support their scholarly activities and contribute to the advancement of knowledge in their respective fields. During the current year, faculty members had the privilege of attending the Palmetto College Tenure and Promotion Workshop, which provided valuable insights and guidance on the tenure and promotion process. They also benefited from a range of workshops offered by the Center for Teaching Excellence, enabling them to refine their instructional techniques and incorporate effective pedagogical strategies into their classrooms. Furthermore, workshops organized by the Office of the Vice President for Research offered faculty opportunities to enhance their research skills and stay updated with the latest trends in their disciplines. Local workshops focused on student health and well-being provided valuable insights to create a supportive environment for students' overall well-being. Through these initiatives, USC Union is committed to empowering faculty members with the necessary resources, support, and professional development opportunities to excel in their teaching, research, and service roles. By investing in faculty growth and development, the institution further enhances the quality of education and fosters an environment of continuous improvement.

Strategic Priority 3: Create new pathways to research excellence in order to become Association of American Universities eligible.

This strategic priority is linked to two distinct goals:

1. Promote research excellence and innovation through enhancement of Phase I indicators.
2. Promote research excellence and innovation through enhancement of Phase II indicators.

This strategic priority does not directly relate to our campus since USC Union functions as a regional campus within the broader USC system, offering associate degree programs. As previously stated, our faculty members actively contribute to research excellence by maintaining a consistent level of productivity in their scholarly endeavors, even with substantial teaching and service responsibilities. We collect data on scholarly productivity based on the calendar year. Regarding scholarly productivity, during the previous calendar year (2022), the faculty at USC Union have documented their scholarly achievements, which encompassed the following: 1 book or monograph, 7 articles or chapters in peer-reviewed journals, 11 book reviews, 3 abstracts, 21 presentations at national or international conferences, 7 presentations at regional conferences, 2 presentations at state conferences, 4 presentations at local conferences, 8 guest lectures, 14 creative works, 16 funded grants, and 2 awards received from sources external to the USC system.

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Palmetto College and the Union campus will maintain their commitment to supporting faculty members in their scholarly pursuits, enhancing their teaching and providing opportunities for students to participate in scholarly activities outside the confines of the conventional classroom. The Union campus will continue to allocate resources (with a budget and expenditure of \$32,752 for 2022-2023) to facilitate faculty travel for presenting their research. Additionally, diligent efforts will be made to establish funding for the USC Union Research and Productive Scholarship fund, with the goal of supporting faculty scholarly endeavors during the summer months at a local level.

Strategic Priority 4: Cultivate a more diverse, equitable and inclusive campus culture where every individual, regardless of background, has the full opportunity to flourish and thrive.

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Improve the relative racial/ethnic and gender representation of our student body, staff and faculty.
2. Ensure that there is equity for all students and staff and faculty members across key measures of success.
3. Create, promote, support and assess a campus culture/climate that embodies our Carolinian Creed and makes every member of our university community feel like they are valued and affirmed.

At the Union campus, our focus revolves around enhancing campus climate and fostering inclusivity. One of our primary endeavors involves finding innovative ways to support the mental well-being of our students, faculty, and staff. Alongside the previously mentioned CARE Team, we are pleased to offer a valuable resource called the Student Assistance Program (SAP), available to all students and their immediate family members. Through our partnership with McLaughlin Young Group, an independent provider of SAP services, enrollment is not required, and this program covers both our regular and dual enrollment students, regardless of their location—whether on campus, online, or at off-site high schools where we offer dual enrollment programs. SAP provides confidential, short-term counseling and personal consultations, free of charge, to address personal and/or professional concerns. Moreover, it extends work-life resources, including legal and financial consultations, online learning support, and various other resources. To further cater to the mental health needs of our on-campus students, USC Union offers Christie Campus Health—a 24/7 virtual platform that provides access to mental health and related services. This program allows for up to three free counseling sessions per issue with a licensed mental health provider, available in-person or remotely, with no limit on the number of unique issues. Additionally, students can explore a range of self-guided resources and enjoy unlimited free access to the Headspace Meditation App. Lastly, in collaboration with the USC Psychological Services Center, USC Union offers telehealth therapy, in-person therapy, and psychological assessments on-campus. These services come at no cost to our students, faculty, or staff, ensuring that mental health support is readily accessible and affordable for everyone within our community. In addition to these services, the campus organizes an annual event called Fresh Check Day, held every September. Fresh Check Day serves as a positive initiative to promote mental health and prevent suicide. The event strives to establish a welcoming and optimistic environment where students feel encouraged to openly discuss mental health topics. It acts as a bridge, connecting students with the various mental health resources accessible on campus, within the community, and on a national level. Fresh Check Day serves as a valuable platform to foster dialogue and increase awareness surrounding mental health issues.

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To promote an inclusive campus culture and environment, the Office of Academic and Student Affairs arranges an annual week-long workshop series in November. These workshops cover a range of important topics, including civil rights/Title IX, sexual harassment, suicide prevention, drug and alcohol abuse awareness, and mental health. While student-athletes are mandated to attend these workshops, they are open to participation by all students, faculty, and staff. This initiative aims to provide comprehensive education and awareness, ensuring that the entire campus community has access to valuable information and resources related to these critical areas. Furthermore, it is mandatory for all students to complete a series of online community education modules. These modules encompass four topics: AlcoholEdu, Sexual Assault and Prevention for Undergraduates, Well-Being, and Diversity, Inclusion & Belonging for Students. These modules serve as a comprehensive educational resource, ensuring that students receive important information and guidance in these areas. In addition to the workshops and community education modules, students actively participate in the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). This national survey assesses institutional practices and student behaviors that strongly correlate with student learning and retention, including aspects related to campus culture and climate. By participating in the CCSSE, students contribute valuable feedback that provides the campus with insightful information on student engagement. This data aids in shaping institutional practices and fostering an environment that supports student success and overall well-being. Lastly, in recognition of the achievements of our first-generation college students, we organize an annual celebration day dedicated to honoring their accomplishments. This year, we arranged a thought-provoking panel discussion featuring faculty and staff members who were also first-generation students. They shared their personal experiences and offered valuable advice to inspire and guide our first-generation college students. In addition, we facilitated an exhibition that connected students with various campus resources, ensuring they had access to the support and assistance they needed. To further commemorate this special occasion, we hosted an exclusive party specifically for our first-generation students, complete with engaging games and exciting prizes. These festivities aimed to celebrate the unique journeys of our first-generation college students and provide them with a supportive and celebratory environment.

At the USC Union campus, we have a dedicated Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion committee. This committee is deeply committed to advocating for diversity-related matters and works towards organizing various initiatives, curricula, events, and activities that align with our core values and the principles outlined in the Carolinian Creed. Their objective is to foster a campus environment that promotes inclusive policies, upholds the rights of all individuals, and stands for positive action. The committee actively recommends institutional policies that affirm the rights and dignity of every person, irrespective of any categorization. Through collaborative efforts with student organizations like the African American Alliance, the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion committee organized a series of engaging events this year. These events encompassed a diverse range of activities aimed at fostering inclusivity and celebrating different cultures and perspectives. Among the highlights were a thought-provoking world religions panel, Unity Day, which brought students together in a spirit of unity and solidarity, and an inspiring black history poetry, art, and music show. Students also had the opportunity to take field trips to the Rosehill Plantation and USC Lancaster Native American Studies Center. These events provided platforms for dialogue, cultural exchange, and artistic expression, creating opportunities for students to broaden their understanding, connect with one another, and celebrate the richness of diversity on campus.

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Strategic Priority 5: Harness the power, attributes and institutional diversity of an integrated and interoperative university system that enhances access, success and affordability for every eligible student S.C. student.

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Develop an internal university system governance structure that establishes high-impact autonomy, service excellence and consistent policies while optimizing performance.
2. Establish an integrated online program management enterprise that maximizes access and affordability for both traditional and nontraditional students in S.C. and beyond.
3. Leverage the university system to provide accelerated, lower-cost multidegree options for students.

USC Union, as a part of Palmetto College, provides accessible and affordable associate degree programs to students both within our service area and beyond. Students have the option to complete their first two years of college credit at USC Union, either through in-person or online instruction, and subsequently pursue their bachelor's degree online. The mission of Palmetto College is to ensure that all South Carolinians, regardless of their location, have access to flexible, affordable, and accessible education. In collaboration with USC Columbia and other comprehensive institutions within the USC system, Palmetto College offers a variety of bachelor's degree programs, including majors such as organizational leadership and liberal studies. Additionally, USC Union provides the opportunity for students to pursue a fully online associate degree.

USC Union is dedicated to delivering high-quality education at an affordable cost. The tuition rate at USC Union for resident students with less than 75 credit hours is \$3,579 per semester, which is consistent across all four Palmetto College campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, Sumter). For the four-year degree programs offered through Palmetto College, the tuition rate is \$5,199 per semester for resident students. This rate is lower than that of the nearest senior campus (Upstate - \$5,604, resident status) and the main campus in Columbia (\$6,144, resident status). The four Palmetto College campuses collaborate with university officials to maintain this lower cost, ensuring that students can access affordable education without compromising on quality.

Strategic Priority 6: Spur innovation and economic development through impactful community partnerships.

This strategic priority is linked to three distinct goals:

1. Create future opportunities in research, education and scholarship through state, federal and industry partnerships.
2. Be an engine for business development in the state of South Carolina.
3. Expand community partnerships to increase business opportunities, develop new relationships and increase experiential learning.

At the Union campus, our efforts to achieve these objectives revolve around seeking opportunities to enrich the educational experience through valuable partnerships with community organizations and institutions. We establish strong connections with the community by offering internships to our students as part of work-study assignments, fulfilling degree requirements for BOL/BLS programs through Palmetto College. While all GLD internships for this year were completed through Columbia or online, we continue to work towards developing a formal internship program for students locally. Additionally,

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our student-athletes actively engage with the community by volunteering with organizations such as the Miracle League and local YMCA. They also contribute by speaking at schools within our service area and offering their support to high school sports teams through volunteering. The community is also heavily involved in and supportive of our athletics program with several organizations sponsoring our teams.

The Union County Arts Council is affiliated with our campus and utilizes our facilities to host a yearly art exhibition. Our campus is connected to the Union County Community Remembrance Project, which seeks to foster collaborative education, justice, and healing through the preservation of the racial history of Union County. Faculty are also involved with the Rose Hill Plantation, where students learn the experiences of formerly enslaved people after emancipation. We continue to develop a formal internship program for students on our campus. Other community partnerships include those with Union County EMS, who train in our nursing simulation lab. We continue to partner with the Union County Sheriff's Office for a backpack school supply giveaway and an Explorer Program. The Lutz Foundation has also awarded USC Union a grant to our nursing program which enabled us to purchase several items that enhance the learning experience including a wound simulation kit.

Strategic Priority 7: Provide a sustainable campus infrastructure – physical, virtual, fundraising and administrative – that supports academic excellence and preeminent student life.

This strategic priority is linked to five distinct goals:

1. Provide a physical campus that support the academic and student life needs of the modern and future university while ensuring the safety of the university community.
2. Provide state-of-the-art virtual infrastructure that supports delivery of academic content and facilitates highly competitive research.
3. Grow fundraising and external funding activities to significantly impact and improve the university's capital, scholarship and academic programs.
4. Ensure administrative activity is focused on innovation, preparedness and increasing transparency.
5. Promote a framework for national leadership in institutional sustainability.

To enhance accessibility for students enrolled in our degree programs locally and across Palmetto College, the Union campus is continuously enhancing its infrastructure and campus resources. Recent improvements include the completion of ADA restroom renovations in the Central Whitener Building, the installation of turf and replacement of HVAC systems in the Jonesville athletic facility, and the construction of two new state-of-the-art classrooms in the Nursing Simulation Building. Ongoing projects involve the installation of new HVAC systems in the Central Whitener Building, the development of a new wet lab in the Nursing Simulation Building, upgrades to the Truluck Gym ADA restrooms, enhancements to the Jonesville athletic facility weightroom and ADA restrooms, the replacement of security cameras on campus, and the installation of a new elevator in the Main Building. Additionally, there are pending projects that include bidding for the Main Building HVAC system, roof replacement for the Truluck Gym, and other initiatives. Starting in Fall 2023, the USC Union Laurens location is undergoing a relocation to a new facility in Clinton, SC. Renovations are currently underway to ensure that the new location can effectively accommodate instructional activities. Additionally, the catalog of online course offerings continues to expand to accommodate students who cannot attend classes in person. For students on campus, improvements to existing facilities continue to make for a

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more enjoyable experience and one that makes it easier to focus on their learning inside and outside of the classroom.

Through prudent financial management, USC Union has been able to address deferred maintenance needs, improve the campus environment, and enhance its educational programs, while maintaining a stable financial position. In turn, these expenditures for improvements have aided in the recruitment and retention of students. The balance for FY23 is projected at \$1,350,000. This is about 20% lower than the original projected goal of \$1,677,183 and represents about a 2.5 months' reserve. This is due to reduced tuition revenues across various student populations this fiscal year (Palmetto College, Dual Enrollment, and regular students), unexpected one-time expenditures, salary increases due to the USC salary market study project, and general increases in the cost of goods and services.

USC Union provides a range of academic scholarships that are awarded for the entire academic year, along with summer scholarships. Additionally, our athletic department receives generous donations from various organizations, such as Arthur State Bank, Velocity, and the Timken Foundation, among others.

Strategic Priority 8: Build teams that win with excellence and character.

This strategic priority is linked with three distinct goals:

1. NCAA Teams will compete at the upper level of their potential at all times.
2. USC will ensure holistic development of student-athletes, measured by graduation, academic achievement and student-athlete wellness.
3. Create and foster a campus environment that drives a winning attitude while instilling character and integrity in competition and in life.

USC Union actively participates in the National Junior College Athletics Association (NJCAA) for sports like baseball, softball, men's soccer, and women's volleyball. We also engage in intercollegiate marksmanship, club bass fishing, and e-gaming. In the upcoming fall, we are excited to introduce a club golf team. As a campus, we prioritize the holistic development of our students and strive for excellence in both their academic and athletic pursuits. To ensure this, we adhere to rigorous student-athlete eligibility standards and comply with the policies governed by the NJCAA. To maintain these standards, we have implemented various practices to support our student-athletes. Academically, we provide mandatory study hall sessions where athletes receive support and guidance to stay on track towards academic success. These study halls are typically held in the Student Academic Success Center, equipped with computer facilities and access to peer-to-peer and professional tutoring services. Student-athletes also receive guidance from advisors within the athletic department who understand the unique challenges and experiences faced by college athletes. These advisors assist in developing academic plans that align with the athletes' goals while considering the demands of their athletic commitments. In addition to NJCAA policies, all coaches establish rules and expectations for student-athletes, fostering their growth and development throughout the year. Student-athletes are expected to adhere to the student code of conduct and other relevant policies outlined in both the USC Union Student Handbook and the Athletic Student Handbook. Coaches conduct end-of-year evaluations to provide feedback on individual performance and offer suggestions for improvement. The dedicated attention and guidance provided to our student-athletes has resulted in numerous athletic awards and consistently high team GPAs, reflecting our commitment to their success. In the academic year 22-23, the Men's Soccer team achieved an impressive 3.6 GPA, securing the second position nationwide. Likewise, the Softball team attained a

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remarkable 3.78 GPA, placing them at the fourth position in the country. Notably, both teams also earned the highest GPAs among all the Palmetto College Campuses in Region 10.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

USC Union actively participates in the USC Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) Program, which has been established in accordance with the guidance of the International Standards Organization. This program ensures that all forms of risk are managed in a systematic, transparent, and credible manner. Risk assessment is an integral part of our long- and short-term institutional planning process.

It is crucial for us to continue providing our services as not doing so would have a negative impact on the statewide objective of enhancing the educational preparedness of South Carolinians. USC Union offers affordable opportunities for high-quality education, particularly benefiting those who are economically disadvantaged within our service area. Failing to achieve our goals would further disadvantage these individuals.

Furthermore, our partnership with USC Aiken in delivering their Bachelor of Science in Nursing program at USC Union plays a vital role in providing high-quality nursing care for our region. By training nurses who choose to remain in the area, we contribute to the overall health and well-being of our service area. Failing to accomplish our goals in this regard would have adverse effects on the community's healthcare services.

To mitigate the potential negative impacts, it may be necessary for our agency to seek state funding for the general operating funds budget. Additionally, increasing the allocation for dual enrollment tuition for high school students and enhancing the availability of state scholarship funds could help address these challenges. We propose that the General Assembly consider taking the following actions to address these potential issues:

1. Increase the allocation of funds to the general operating budget.
2. Enhance the revenue provided for dual credit students.
3. Increase the availability of state scholarship funds.

By implementing these measures, we can better ensure the continued success and positive impact of USC Union on our community.

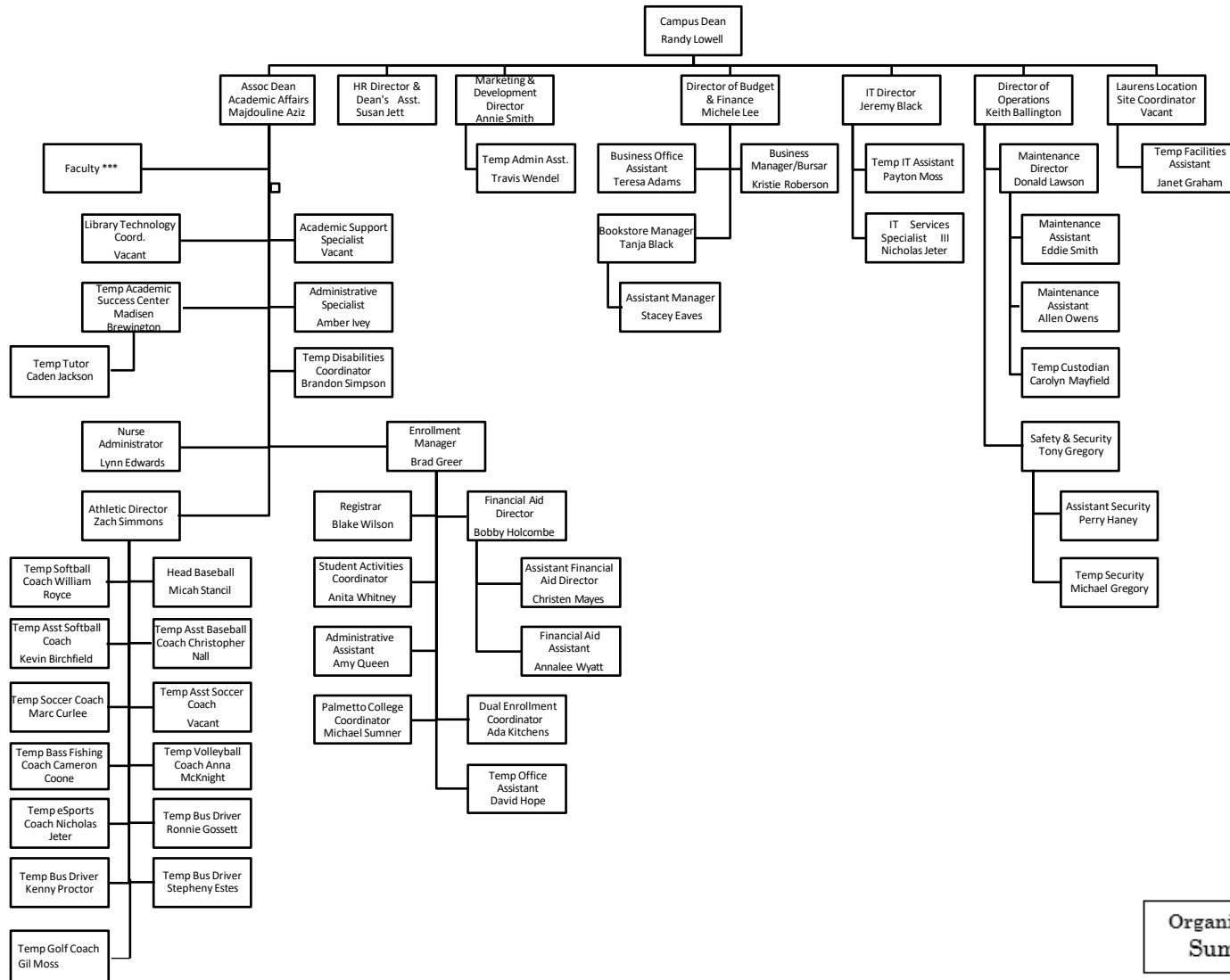

The Union regional Palmetto College campus is a branch campus of the University of South Carolina Columbia. Union has as its mission to provide higher education and intellectual leadership for its service area. At the heart of this mission is a teaching faculty of high quality dedicated to excellence in instruction, scholarship, public and professional service, and creative endeavor which enrich the classroom experience. The Union regional Palmetto College campus offers a varied curriculum grounded in the liberal arts and focused on preparing students to continue their education in the University of South Carolina System and throughout life. The Union regional Palmetto College campus recruits students prepared to succeed in completing a baccalaureate-level education. While the institution does not offer remedial instruction, it is nonetheless able to admit most students who apply due to the close working relationship between students and faculty. The Union regional Palmetto College campus was established to encourage higher education in the counties of Chester, Cherokee, Fairfield, Laurens, Union, and York. The original design of the institution incorporated a flexibility that has allowed changes in institutional capability with increasing educational demands of constituents. Through classroom and laboratory instruction delivered in a variety of face-to-face and distance learning formats and modalities, the institution awards the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees and provides for the completion of selected bachelor's degrees on campus through cooperative agreements and delivery structures with other University of South Carolina System institutions. The Union regional Palmetto College campus also provides general education and upper division coursework applicable to baccalaureate degree programs offered through colleges and universities nationwide. In addition to academic coursework, the mission of the campus includes noncredit courses, seminars, and workshops made available to the community for cultural enrichment and professional development. The traditions of cultural diversity and freedom of thought are valued at the Union regional Palmetto College campus. In a learning environment that develops respect for racial, geographical, intellectual, and economic diversity and an awareness of individual, societal, and global responsibilities, Union promotes courses, activities, and attitudes which influence the life of the mind in men and women and instill in them a thirst to continue learning throughout life. The Union regional Palmetto College campus emphasizes the development of the whole person and especially seeks to foster in students the disciplines essential to an educated citizenry. Core competencies, including the ability to communicate through effective writing and articulate speech; computational and quantitative mastery; creative and critical thinking; and the duties of citizenship are strategically integrated within the curriculum. Classroom experiences, student activities, and physical education programs also provide opportunities for cultural enrichment, leadership development, intellectual growth and interpersonal relationships, all contributing to a sense of self-reliance and a joy of learning.
