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AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Since 1801, the University of South Carolina Columbia has shared the goals, triumphs, and hardships of its state. Within the very name of our university rests its most solemn obligation: the obligation to the people of South Carolina. That includes not just admitting more South Carolinians but ensuring that they are academically prepared for higher education, that they can enter the University of South Carolina system at a place and time that is most convenient and affordable for them, that they can move within our system without barriers or challenges and that their academic training aligns with available job opportunities within our state and in an increasingly competitive global marketplace.

In 2020, the University launched a new strategic plan. This strategic plan, *A Path to Excellence*, is the product of months of hard work and thoughtful deliberation and dedication by great leaders, committed students, talented faculty members, innovative researchers, committed staff members along with corporate and community partners. The ideals of respect, empathy, humility and integrity spoken in the Carolinian Creed form the moral foundation for this undertaking as we work to ensure that the university remains an innovative, welcoming destination for tomorrow’s students, researchers, entrepreneurs, game-changers and leaders. By serving the people of the great state of South Carolina, we acknowledge our responsibility to educate the citizens and concurrently aspire to greater recognition as one of the nation’s finest comprehensive institutions of higher education.

The priorities in *A Path to Excellence* expand areas of inclusiveness and improve ability for strategic planning to guide and evaluate a broader footprint of activity within the University. Honoring its rich history and proud South Carolina home, the University of South Carolina Columbia is a public university that pursues excellence through seven strategic priorities:

- The best students
- World-class faculty and staff
- Outstanding Research
- Increase diversity
- Affordability and Accessibility
- Communities Partnerships
- Excellent Infrastructure

The University of South Carolina Columbia is a globally recognized, high-impact research university dedicated to providing a superior student experience. South Carolina, one of the fastest-growing flagship universities in the nation, offers abundant opportunities for students to succeed, from cutting-edge research initiatives to highly personal student services, from top-ranked academic programs to top-ranked athletics teams.

South Carolina has long offered a comprehensive range of undergraduate, graduate and professional programs. By offering exemplary programs and keeping an eye on tomorrow’s needs, South Carolina provides its successful graduates educational resources and professional expertise that our state demands. And the university does it by providing opportunities to study, conduct research and get hands-on experience at locations throughout the state. The University of South Carolina Columbia campus has 60 nationally ranked programs — in areas such as the health sciences, engineering, law and the arts — according to U.S. News & World Report, as well as the nation’s best public honors college, and it is known for world-class research, a dedicated and committed faculty and exciting athletic and cultural events. The Darla Moore School of Business is ranked number one for undergraduate international business and number one for the international business MBA by U.S News. The

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University also has the top online nursing graduate program, the number one sports science program, and is ranked as the number one public university in the nation for first-year experience.

As our world changes constantly — sometimes seemingly overnight — an agile university committed to properly serving its students, community and state well into the future must periodically reevaluate its priorities, opportunities and goals. It is in this light that a new strategic plan has been created to propel the University of South Carolina to future successes.

LEADING THROUGH NEW TIMES

If there is one constant for colleges and universities, it is that the higher education landscape is always changing. The primary responsibility of any university is serving its students. In a world that is ever-changing, the University of South Carolina Columbia must continue to focus on the strategic horizon and be diligent both today and as the institution plans for the future. To be the flagship university of South Carolina, the institution must serve the people of this state by evaluating this shifting landscape and making the necessary adjustments that produce leaders of character to meet the educational, professional, economic and corporate needs of this great state.

Dr. Michael Amiridis became the 30th president of the University of South Carolina on July 1, 2022. Dr. Amiridis led the University of Illinois Chicago as its chancellor since 2015. Prior to leading UIC, Amiridis spent more than two decades at the University of South Carolina Columbia campus as a faculty member and administrator, serving from 2009 to 2015 as the university’s executive vice president for academic affairs and provost. As a researcher, Dr. Amiridis earned the National Science Foundation's award for early-career scientists and engineers in 1999, was elected a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science in 2012, and was elected a fellow of the American Institute of Chemical Engineers in 2015.

Dr. Donna Arnett started her role as the new executive vice president for academic affairs and provost on August 1, 2022. From 2016-2022, Dr. Arnett led the University of Kentucky College of Public Health as dean, before joining the University of South Carolina’s leadership team as EVP for academic affairs and provost. Dr. Arnett has published more than 700 peer-reviewed papers and two edited volumes, and she had 25 years of continuous NIH funding. She has been named a World Expert in hypertension, body mass index and genetic polymorphisms by Expertscape, a recognition earned by being in the top 0.1 percent of scholars writing about these topics over the previous ten years. She also served as the national president of the American Heart Association, where she became the first epidemiologist to serve in that role.

The challenges facing higher education are many, but President Amiridis is confident in the university's ability to address them with a commitment to excellence, transparency and accessibility. As the university's 30th president, he is drawing on his experience as a faculty member, academic administrator and higher education leader to guide South Carolina into its next era of success.

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The Best Students

The University of South Carolina Columbia welcomed almost 8,050 new students to the Columbia campus in Fall 2021. The freshman class was more diverse and had more in-state students than any previous class. All combined, of the new students who were freshman, transfers and participants in the residential bridge program more than 4,700 were from South Carolina. African American freshman enrollment grew by has grown by 85 percent since 2016. Underrepresented minority freshman enrollment has jumped 62 percent since 2016. Hispanic freshman enrollment is up 53 percent since 2016. Over 16 percent of the 2021 freshman class were first-generation college students. About 596 freshmen were enrolled in the South Carolina Honors College and an estimated 1400 freshmen participated in the Capstone Scholars program. Including graduate and professional students, overall enrollment at the Columbia campus for Fall 2021 was 35,471. Graduate and professional school enrollment increased from 7,481 in Fall 2020 to 8,807 in Fall 2021.

World-class Faculty and Staff

Under the leadership of the Office of the Provost, the University of South Carolina Columbia is committed to recruiting and retaining faculty who can transform the lives of our students and transform the world with their research and scholarship. The University is working to pair faculty with a diverse, dedicated staff who together with our faculty will produce and instill a shared culture of excellence for the University. With just over 6,100 first-time, full-time freshmen enrolling in fall 2021, a world class faculty is an essential component to quality education. USC Columbia strives to maintain a low student to faculty ratio of 18:1, ensuring students receive quality, personalized attention and support. USC supports its faculty selection and retention efforts with a campaign to assess and improve faculty salaries to better align with national standards; the dedication of resources to attracting and retaining internationally recognized faculty; and the improvement of faculty mentoring opportunities and professional development.

Outstanding Research

In fiscal year 2022, faculty garnered \$237 million in research and sponsored awards funding. The University launched a new grant writing program called Propel that focuses on intensive mentoring and workshops. This new initiative is geared toward early-career faculty researchers with small grants who are ready to go for large NIH or NSF grants. Participants receive nine months of intensive support through workshops, mentorship, peer feedback and editing assistance. Another new initiative called the STAR program targets senior faculty researchers and provide insight into identifying, applying for and successfully managing major federal center grants.

Increase Diversity

In 2020, the university hired its first Vice President of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion and committing additional resources to support diversity efforts. Over the past year the Council of Academic Diversity Officers (CADO) has implemented search committee training (primarily for search committee chairs and affirmative action advocates). Four training sessions were provided in the fall in partnership with the Offices for International Scholars, Talent Acquisition, and Equal Opportunity Programs. Every academic unit was represented at the training sessions.

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The Office of Diversity and Inclusion provided over \$200,000 in internal research for funding to faculty through the racial justice and equity research fund. Diversity and Inclusive Excellence mini-grants have been a successful initiative. Up to \$2,000 is provided for creative program, events and academic multicultural initiatives that foster collaborative partnership and encourage diversity, equity and inclusion across all dimensions of identity. Mini-grants are open to students, registered student clubs and organizations, faculty and staff.

In June 2021, the University successfully implemented a system by which students, faculty, and staff can self-select their preferred name, pronoun, and gender identity. Now that phase one of the project is complete, the University will begin work on phase two of the project to connect self-selected data to other parts of the University’s enterprise system.

Affordability and Accessibility

The University of South Carolina Columbia serves a diverse population of students with widely varying backgrounds, career goals, and levels of aspiration. Sixteen percent of the new Fall 2021 freshman class was first-generation college students. Of the 8,050 estimated new freshmen, transfers and participants in the residential bridge program, 53% were from South Carolina. In addition to in-state residents, the new freshman class had students from forty-six (46) other states and the District of Columbia.

The university offers over 320 degrees at the bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and professional program levels, affording students the most comprehensive array of educational programs in the state. Opportunities for personal and career development are provided to the citizens of South Carolina through outreach and continuing education activities. The university provides additional opportunities for associate degrees through Fort Jackson and through the oversight of regional Palmetto College campuses (Lancaster, Salkehatchie, Sumter, and Union).

Through classroom and laboratory instruction delivered in a variety of face-to-face and distance learning formats and modalities, degree programs are offered in the following areas: arts and sciences; business; education; engineering and computing; hospitality, retail, and sport management; information and communications; law; medicine; music; nursing; pharmacy; public health; and social work. The depth and breadth of its graduate programs distinguishes the University of South Carolina Columbia from all other institutions of higher learning in South Carolina.

Community Partnerships

The University is a major economic driver for the Palmetto State. The University of South Carolina Columbia offers Columbia a major competitive asset that has the potential to significantly boost growth throughout the next decade and beyond – namely, the presence of a high-skilled workforce. This implies that the University’s total economic impact in the Midlands has the potential to increase substantially in the coming decade. The total annual economic impact of the University on the Columbia metropolitan region is approximately \$3.7 billion. This figure reflects the dollar volume of all economic activity that can be attributed to – directly or indirectly – the University of South Carolina Columbia. This includes increases in alumni wages that are earned and spent in the local community, ongoing business activities resulting from non-state funded expenditures, and all activities associated with university athletics.

The University of South Carolina Columbia contributes \$1.7 billion towards personal income and supports approximately 43,876 jobs in the Midlands community, 13,705 of which represent employees working directly at

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the institution. These estimates imply that the University supports approximately 1 in every 9 jobs in the Columbia metropolitan region.

The university’s uniquely large contribution to Columbia’s economy puts it in a position to take a leadership role in developing a strategy that Columbia can implement in the coming years in order to boost its rate of long-run economic growth. Such a strategy will be critical as the region recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic, especially considering that over the past decade Columbia’s growth rate has lagged almost all other metropolitan regions of comparable size in the Southeast.

Excellent Infrastructure

Over the past year, the University completed a \$3 million dollar upgrade to the wireless network on the Columbia campus, providing faster, more reliable service to students and employees. Technology used to deliver instruction in nearly 500 classrooms was expanded and upgraded. The University has made significant improvements in Research Computing efforts, providing 99.999 percent uptime on high performance computing resources, despite the shift to remote work. Initial work has started on the Carolina Enclave for Secure Research, which will provide a segmented and monitored environment that allows researchers to store and analyze sensitive data. This is an exciting development for the University, and a result of several partnerships across the system to help design and define requirements. The Division of Information Technology integrated Banner with the new University Library Shared System, Alma, for all eight campuses. The new statewide Shared Library Services Platform is designed with advanced technologies and increased accessibility for students, faculty and staff. The transition to the new system is an example of a trend in academic libraries nationwide to leverage technology, work more collaboratively and strategically, improve the user experience, and maximize the benefits of collections and limited resources. The University made a commitment to provide accessible content in all digital spaces. This past fiscal year a new accessibility website was launched. In addition, university policy IT 5.00 Digital Accessibility was adopted by the Board of Trustees that defines accessibility compliance at the university. In order to improve efficiency, 15 IT service desks from across the system came together to provide students and employees a single point-of-contact for all service requests.

There are several improvements to the technology infrastructure that help reduce downtime, increase reliability, and provide a more stable environment. For example, improvements to temperature monitoring of technology distros— distros are network connectivity distribution points that are located in various locations across campus. They connect end-user devices to the core network. Notifications for humidity, temperature fluctuations, power outages, and power fluctuations were installed on distros, as well as water intrusion monitors. This work improved dependability and efficiency. The University also increased automation for monitoring, metric data, and network asset entry. Network switches and wireless access points in Greek Village were also upgraded.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies

The University has implemented a comprehensive Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) program which incorporates the fundamentals of risk identification, risk assessment, risk treatment, risk monitoring and review. The University has established this process using the guidance of International Standards Organization (ISO) 31000-2018 “Risk Management - Principals and Guidelines”. ISO provides the principles, framework and process for managing any form of risk in a systematic, transparent and credible manner. The ERM program operates within an established University ERM committee structure to provide a detailed picture of high priority risk areas as identified by upper management. Identified high priority risk areas include: governance, legislative relations, economic decline, emergency planning, disaster recovery, business continuity, laboratory safety, student safety, crime prevention, title IX compliance, data security and privacy, institutional data reporting, capital project management/deferred maintenance, enrollment management, personnel recruiting and retention/succession planning, research compliance, and IT system implementation. As necessary, the University monitors and tracks these high priority risk areas and implements actions plans to effectively control these risks.

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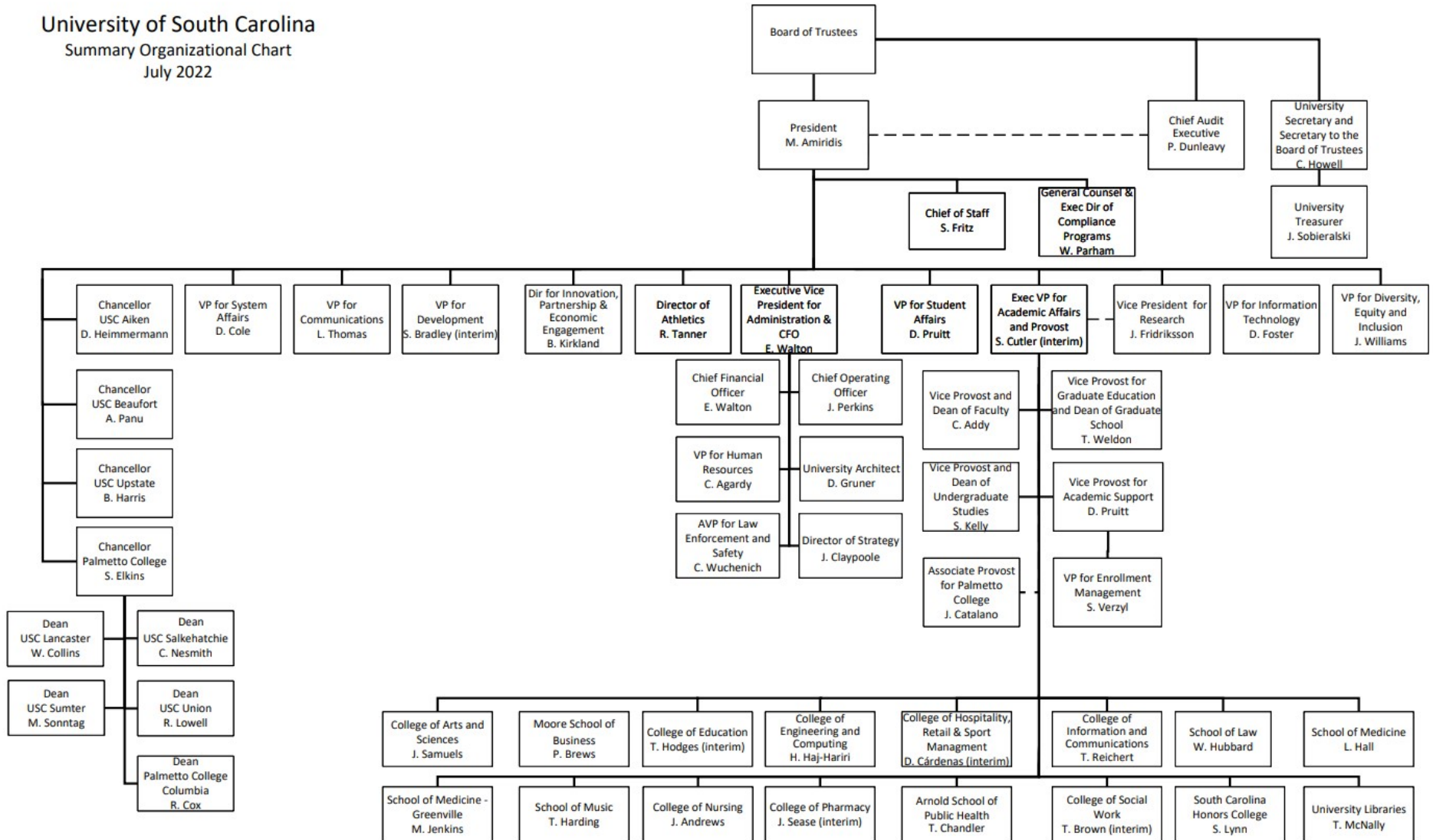
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University of South Carolina
