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## **AGENCY’S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

Founded in 1961, USC Aiken is a comprehensive institution with a strong liberal arts and science focus. The institution functions as part of the University of South Carolina system, combining the advantages of a more personalized education afforded by a mid-sized institution with the resources of a major research university. USC Aiken offers bachelor's degrees in nearly 30 areas, including several online bachelor's degree programs, and selected master's degrees designed to enhance and serve our region's advanced workforce needs. With a Fall 2021 enrollment of nearly 3,900, USC Aiken focuses on personal attention, deployment of engaged learning pedagogies, quality teaching, and an active campus environment. Small classes are taught by professors rather than teaching assistants and afford students one-on-one relationships with experienced faculty, individual advisement, and research opportunities, all of which support the institution's commitment to helping students achieve academic success. USC Aiken has strong ties with the community and offers a diverse non-credit program, including certificate programs and continuing education for members of the surrounding area. U.S. News & World Report ranks USC Aiken among the Best Public Baccalaureate Colleges in the South. Colleges of Distinction has also recognized the university for its continued dedication to High-Impact Educational Practices that influence both student learning and student success. Our Veterans and Military Student Success Center has continued to receive national attention and various accolades with multiple national rankings. USC Aiken is a member of the Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges (COPLAC), the only institution in South Carolina with that designation. This designation shows a commitment to the critical thinking, communication, and analytical skills necessary to be successful in today's workforce.

USC Aiken's small and active campus environment gives students numerous opportunities to be involved in campus life. Student involvement offerings include community service, Greek life, intramural and club sports, leadership development programs, and more than 95 clubs and organizations – truly something for everyone. On-campus housing can accommodate almost 1,000 students, providing opportunities for students to enjoy the traditional college experience. Our student-athletes, the Pacers, compete in NCAA Division II sports as part of the competitive Peach Belt Conference in baseball, men's and women's basketball, cross country, golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, and volleyball. Through campus programming, a wide range of activities from comedians to cultural events are planned for students, by students, based on their interests.

As we continue our Leading Forward Strategic Plan, USC Aiken continues to strive toward academic excellence with goals and objectives that support delivery of high-level programs and enhancement of initiatives that support student success, retention, progression, and degree attainment. USC Aiken expands on previous goals by focusing on increased student engagement in and out of the classroom, on campus, and throughout the community. We plan to expand partnerships in the local community, nationally, and internationally. We have already developed academic agreements with new partners internationally. We also continue to grow our local partnerships, as we begin the fifth year of the Aiken Scholars Academy, a high school for gifted students on the USC Aiken campus, offering a unique and engaging educational structure that will introduce students to, and immerse them in, the collegiate environment. This year we welcomed our first group of Aiken Scholars Academy graduates who enrolled as full-time students at USC Aiken.

The University's student body is 91% from the state of South Carolina and racially diverse with approximately 40% from under-represented racial and ethnic groups. We have seen a significant increase in the proportion of first generation and low-income students that make up our student body; 25% of our undergraduate degree-seeking students are the first in the family to attend college, and 37% are Pell-eligible. The size of the student body at the University has grown in recent years, primarily due to enrollment at the master's level. Our graduate online business program enrollment grew by approximately 40% over the last three years, but by only 2% over

the past year. USC Aiken has developed expanded online undergraduate degree program offerings to meet growing need in the state and enrollment in those programs (e.g., Psychology, Communication, and Cybersecurity) is starting to grow. The University of South Carolina Aiken has continued to grow its newer degree programs. We completed our conversion of our Fine Arts major to more focused programs in Theater, Art, and Music. We added degree programs in Mechanical Engineering and in Spanish with a focus on translation and interpretation. Our on-ground programs in cybersecurity and Emerging Media have been growing rapidly. The FBI and NSA have expressed interest in the skill sets that students in these programs will obtain. In efforts to address the critical needs of South Carolina for more nurses and educators, USC Aiken recently began offering its nursing and education degrees at rural sites across South Carolina in partnership with USC Sumter, USC Union, and USC Salkehatchie.

USC Aiken’s efforts to support veteran and military students earned a National Top 10 for small public universities and a Gold rating from Military Friendly. A recent restarting of Army ROTC Pacer Detachment at USC Aiken will yield its first student commissioning as an Army Second Lieutenant this May, the first such from USC Aiken since 2012.

Changing generational approaches to education and exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, undergraduate recruitment and retention have become increasingly challenging. The 2017 cohort first-year retention rate was 64%, climbed to 66% for the 2019 cohort, and slipped to 59% for the Fall 2020 cohort who entered the university in the height of the pandemic. Early tracking of the Fall 2021 cohort indicates a 2% improvement. Several years ago, a Retention, Progression and Graduation (RPG) Committee was constituted to review trends, identify issues, examine reports, whitepapers, and existing evidence to determine best practices and deliver specific actionable recommendations related to the RPG of our students. This committee has been refined and refocused to work on identification of barriers to retention, progression, and graduation among our students. In the past, this committee has made recommendations related to Early Warnings, re-examination of placement testing, and review of probation and suspension policies. More recently, the committee has recommended examining our transfer policies and additional early supports for new students. In 2021, USC Aiken launched a department of Transfer Student Initiatives and Services to help improve the experience for students transferring into USC Aiken. With this initiative, we have also collaborated with Aiken Technical College in a Reverse Transfer program through the National Student Clearinghouse. Additionally, USC Aiken was accepted into the AACSC/Aspen Institute Transfer Intensive and have partnered with the two-year institutions with the USC system. The RPG committee has also recently recommended reviewing our current General Education curriculum and our Writing Proficiency Profile. Faculty workgroups have begun to work on both of these initiatives to ensure they are meeting the needs of our students and aligned with best practice.

Research from the RPG Committee in conjunction with strategic planning efforts identified academic advising as an area for improvement. As such, the University launched a redesign of academic advising in Fall 2021, which included creating a centralized advising center staffed with professional advisors to serve first-year students. Early data for Fall 2022 appears that the pilot year had a positive impact on first-year retention. However, the Office of Academic Advising is continuing to grow and was able to begin engaging with the Fall 2022 first-year students in summer 2022, so we hope to continue to see improvements with first-year retention in the coming years. One key tool for the Office of Academic Advising is an advanced online portal called Navigate that will help provide a wealth of student information in one place to streamline academic advising, improve the early warning data collection from faculty, provide targeted push communication to students, and provide insightful data-tracking and note-taking.

USC Aiken continues its long tradition of working closely with our regional businesses, industry, and other entities to leverage the strengths of our partnerships. We continue to partner with institutions overseas for

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study abroad opportunities and student exchanges. The university has also continued to partner with various entities of the surrounding community including Aiken Regional Medical Center, Aiken County Government, Aiken County Public Safety, and the City of North Augusta in programs focused on preventative and rehabilitative services, community-based instruction, and other initiatives. Our Ruth Patrick Science Education Center continues to offer support to the K-12 educational system and to promote the STEM disciplines. With a pre-pandemic average of over 70,000 visits per year, the Ruth Patrick Science Education Center is a major contributor to increasing STEM education in K-12 in our region. USC Aiken has developed exciting partnerships with the Department of Energy (DOE) and the Department of Defense (DOD) which include new facilities to be constructed on USC Aiken’s campus. The DOE’s Savannah River National Laboratory, using federal funds, will begin construction this month of the Advanced Manufacturing Collaborative, which will also house USC Aiken’s ABET-accredited engineering programs and related computational programs. The DOD’s South Carolina National Guard, using federal and state funds, is in the beginning design stages for a Readiness facility and Cybersecurity Dreamport facility, which will also be the new home of USC Aiken’s cybersecurity programs.

Numerous studies have found that engaged faculty are essential if initiatives related to student success, program development, research advancement, and economic contributions are to be successful. Competitiveness in the national market to recruit faculty determines the degree to which we can acquire and maintain qualified faculty, particularly in the face of growing enrollment demands. A significant number of faculty and staff retirements and resignations have prompted heightened competition with other institutions for qualified personnel and success in recruiting staff is linked to our ability to compete with the companies and industries located in Aiken and Aiken County. Coupled with this are difficulties in attracting and retaining faculty and staff given state pay limitations, the existence of low state appropriations that do not allow for salary increases and inequity / compression adjustments, and burnout from mandated initiatives at the federal, state, and system level. Meanwhile, current faculty, have serious concerns about salary compression, the larger issue of disinvestment, and the prospects for future support of their academic work. USC Aiken’s fair wage initiative recently completed its fifth and final year. This plan helped address salary disparities for faculty and staff. However, this continues to be a moving target. We have made efforts to hire new faculty in line with comparable peers using CUPA benchmarks, but this does not address the salaries of incumbent faculty and staff. There was a statewide salary increase of 3% in 2022 and state employees will also receive a bonus. In addition, USC Aiken is providing an employee bonus. However, University administration is still exploring options for the next phase of the Fair Wage Plan to address these ongoing issues.

To ensure that we provide high quality support to our incoming and continuing students, USC Aiken has renovated various buildings across campus. The university has transformed spaces within the Gregg-Graniteville Library to better support Student Success and to house the Office of Academic Advising. HVAC renovations and interior renovations have continued. With recently allocated state funding, the Business & Education building gym will be renovated to house a new Center for Teaching Excellence and the Office for Online Learning and Support, along with administrative office space. These dedicated spaces testify to the value USC Aiken places on high-quality instruction and will enhance support of faculty seeking to further adopt and improve high impact practices. USC Aiken values our outdoor space as well and continues to be recognized as a Tree Campus for the ninth consecutive year.

The challenges facing the University of South Carolina Aiken continue to be associated with those that are generally impacting public higher education institutions in the United States. As student populations decline, universities compete for students in ever-increasing fashion. Large, research universities that can best attract out-of-state students have significant pressures applied to focus more on in-state students – the traditional and foundational reason-for-being of South Carolina’s public comprehensive universities. Thankfully, with additional state funding support, USC Aiken has been able to hold tuition flat for the last five years. This is highly impactful

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for our student population, 91% who are from South Carolina. In fact, for Fall 2021, nearly one half of all USC Aiken undergraduate students paid \$0 out-of-pocket for tuition and mandatory fees and over more than 7 in 10 paid \$2500 or less. Significant financial challenges remain as current state funding sits at 15% of the annual budget against the backdrop of a mandated 3% raise for all employees, an 18% increase in healthcare premiums this year, and 8% inflation. DOE and DOD construction projects will require significant additional investment by USC Aiken to move athletic facilities, upgrade engineering and computational labs, and tie those projects into the university’s campus. Additional financial challenges are anticipated as students need increasing levels of support in both academic and mental health arenas, and as the state incentivizes university-bound students to attend technical schools instead of universities. USC Aiken supports the engagement of high school students as dual-enrolled students; however, financial strain on the university can arise as dual-enrolled students only contribute 15% of the normal tuition cost and further decrease the population of students who have traditionally attended university for four years. The confluence of these forces creates a challenging environment for our public institutions to flourish.

In the unlikely event that USC Aiken is unable to achieve its goals and objectives, the public of South Carolina would lose a high quality public post-secondary education at the baccalaureate and master’s level. The resulting economic fallout would be severe, as USC Aiken contributes over \$350 million to the state economy and the availability of qualified employees entering the workforce would be significantly impacted. Further, there would be loss of cultural and athletic events that are crucial to the region’s appeal. There are several things the General Assembly could do to mitigate the risk of such a crisis. First, the General Assembly could continue to increase funding of USC Aiken and public higher education in general to be more in line with investment levels of North Carolina and Georgia. Companion unfunded mandates should be avoided as they mute the impact of funding increases in funding. Recent increased funding for deferred maintenance has been impactful and should be continued.

USC Aiken continues to increase the number of degrees awarded and is committed to answering the call to credential more South Carolinians. With internal investments in student success and external partnerships bringing federal funds to the South Carolina, USC Aiken is well positioned for continued and increasing impact on the region and the state.

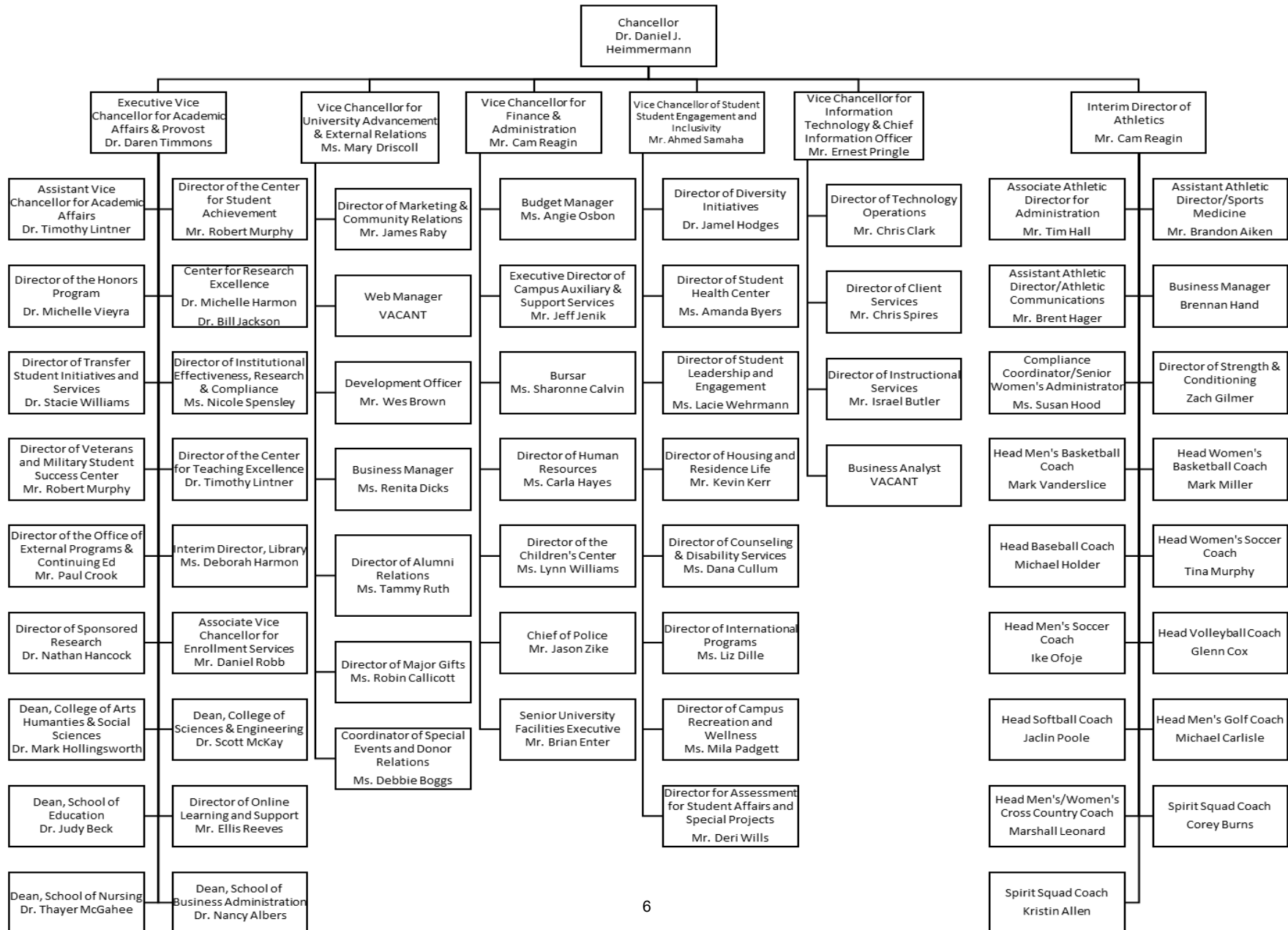
