This bill prohibits a physician from performing a dismemberment abortion unless the abortion is necessary to prevent serious health risk to the mother. The bill outlines the penalties for performing unauthorized dismemberment abortions and specifies which parties have a cause of action against a physician or other person who unlawfully performs such an action.

Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation. This bill does not alter the responsibilities of the Board of Medical Examiners, which is regulated by LLR. Therefore, this bill will have no impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Department of Health and Environmental Control. DHEC indicates that this bill makes no additional requirements of their department in regards to their regulatory oversight of facilities that perform abortions. Therefore, this bill will have no impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Judicial Department. The Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office does not anticipate that this bill will have an immediate expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

However, should this legislation result in a significant number of additional hearings or trials, the courts may experience an increase in expenditures and an increased number of cases to the court docket.
