Fiscal Impact Summary

The bill does not have an expenditure impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds as it requires no actions by any agency to allow the Attorney General and assistant attorneys general to carry a concealable weapon anywhere within this State when carrying out the duties of their office. These persons must possess a valid concealed weapon permit issued pursuant to Article 4, Chapter 31 of Title 23.

State Expenditure

This bill allows the Attorney General and assistant attorneys general to carry a concealable weapon anywhere within this State when carrying out the duties of their office. These persons must possess a valid concealed weapon permit issued pursuant to Article 4, Chapter 31 of Title 23. The bill does not require any agency action and does not operationally or fiscally impact state agencies or local governments.
