This bill eliminates the outdated code section which places the Division of Public Charities within the Office of the Attorney General and provides for the office's administration of the South Carolina Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act.

The Office of the Attorney General and the Office of the Secretary of State report that implementation of the bill will result in no expenditure impact, as the Division of Public Charities was moved to the Office of the Secretary of State from the Office of the Attorney General after 1998 pursuant to Section 33-56-10 et al.
